### Milborne Port Opera

In 1990 a group of friends and work colleagues living in Milborne Port got together to perform Gilbert and Sullivan's **Trial by Jury** to raise funds to equip the newly built Village Hall. The show, performed on the floor of the Hall with minimal scenery and costume, was such a success that it was decided to continue and form a company, grandly christened **Milborne Port Opera** (MPO), which, over the last 32 years has become increasingly professional in its approach to performing not only the entire published works of Gilbert and Sullivan but several others, including three world premieres written by MPO member Neil Edwards.

In 1905 Franz Lehar, a Hungarian musician based in Vienna collaborated with Viktor Leon, one of the most important and successful librettists of the Viennese operetta scene, to produce Die Lustige Witwe, better known to the English speaking world as **The Merry Widow** and, in 2004, Horsington resident Chris Bailward directed the version adapted for amateur companies by Phil Park and Ronald Hanmer, bringing, in the words of one reviewer "poignant romance to this vivacious, fast moving and colourful show, while capturing the spirit of Paris and of the folksy, if imaginary, eastern European principality of Pontevedro".

Fast forward to 2019 when MPO had just completed a sell-out production of **Anything Goes** by Cole Porter and decided that their next performance would be the lesser known **The Arcadians** by Lionel Monkton and Howard Talbot. The show was in full rehearsal for performance the week after Easter 2020 when we all know what happened: Covid 19 caused the world to seize up and, with heavy heart, **MPO**, along with all other companies, both amateur and professional, went into hibernation, not knowing when, or if, they would ever perform again.

But C19 was not enough to destroy more than 30 years of history and a concert performance of **The Arcadians**, with minimal costume and no scenery, apart from an imaginative video, made by Horsington's own Richard Gaunt, projected onto Milborne Port Village Hall's newly fitted cinema screen, to transport the small, socially distanced but highly appreciative audience to Arcadia, was staged at the end of September 2021.

Normal practice for **MPO** is to decide on a production in May and then rehearse once a week from the beginning of September until performance the week after Easter. Having entrusted Chris Bailward with a new production of **The Merry Widow** for performance in 2022, the Group was faced with, not only reduced rehearsal time, but a lack of rehearsal space because the normal venue, Milborne Port Primary School, was unwilling to allow us to use their hall because of C19 concerns. However we started to learn the music in **Church House** Milborne Port on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2021 before moving to **Leweston School** at the end of November to set movement and dialogue. Although the space was far from ideal and we were disrupted by the need for several of the cast and production team to self-isolate during rehearsals, we were able to set Naomi Booth's imaginative choreography, with waltzing assistance from Allison Gosney to great effect and **The Merry Widow** was performed from 20<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2022.

The set, designed by Chris Bailward, was beautifully realised by Neil Harrison-Shaw, Trevor John and Naomi Booth who all played their respective parts on stage as well, and transported the audience firstly to the Pontevedrian Embassy, complete with grand staircase, and then to a garden with a view over the Paris skyline.

**The Merry Widow** stands or falls on a charismatic central performance and Jessie Stones, who first appeared for **MPO** aged 17 as Phyllis in **Iolanthe**, provided just the right balance of confidence and romantic allure, as the eponymous Widow, her beautiful soprano voice filling the Hall. Anthony White provided an excellent foil as Danilo, the lazy, sybaritic Pontevedrian Attaché, more at home with the "ladies" of the demi-monde, than with high society and James Craw and Rachel Milestone-

McAdorey fulfilled their roles as the hopeful lover and the Ambassador's wife to great effect. The bumbling Ambassador played by long-serving MPO member and former resident Horsington Andrew Armstrong, brought his beautiful singing voice and strong stage presence to the role and the principals were supported by a well characterised 28 strong cast of singers and actors. including



Horsington's Richard Gaunt as the scheming Factotum to the Ambassador.

A reviewer opined that "ably directed by Chris Bailward with musical director Caroline D'Cruz, it's as frothy as a shaken bottle of Bolly" and the smaller than usual audiences, possibly still concerned about C19, were highly appreciative of the performance both of the actors and the 12-piece band who sounded better than ever before.



Of the cast who performed **The Merry Widow** in 2004 only 7

remained to perform in 2022 and, although we have many loyal members both on stage and behind the scenes, we are always looking for new recruits to continue the high standards we have attained. If you're interested drop Chris Bailward (07801960175) a line.

#### From the Rector


As our Queen celebrates 70 years of being our Servant Queen under the King of the universe she serves, let us join with her in renewing our faith in her Lord and ours.


