RBL 'Pedal to Paris'





Wincanton Branch member and serving Officer Lt. Col. Colin Thomas is once again taking on the huge challenge of the RBL's 'Pedal to Paris', at the beginning of September. Setting off from London, the four-day event will pass through beautiful English and French countryside covering a total of 460km. Once in France, there will be coordinated rolling road closures so those taking part can cycle from Calais to the very heart of Paris without having to think about traffic, junctions or red lights. This is the only cycling event apart from the Tour de France that the Arc de Triomphe closes for. Day one covers 85 miles from London to Dover, Day 2 Calais to Abberville which is 65 miles, Day 3 is from Abberville to Beauvais covering 65 miles and Day 4 is from Beauvais to Paris covering 63 miles. 'I write as the chair of a group developing a Dementia Friendly Neighbourhood covering the South Somerset East area of Bruton, Castle Cary, Wincanton, Queen Camel and Milborne Port, and the surrounding villages. My background is that I was a local GP and the county lead for dementia in Somerset. We are keen to work with interested individuals, parish and town councillors, voluntary sector organisations and local businesses to help make a better place for people who have a dementia, and their family members who help to care for them. Dementia can have an affect people of all ages – either directly or by impacting on families, including people of working age juggling work with acting as carers or on children with relatives with dementia. We would like to invite you to what promises to be a very interesting talk by Ian Sherriff (bio below) who, amongst many other things, is a dementia adviser to No.10 Downing Street. We are meeting at Wincanton Memorial Hall on Tuesday 28 June at 1pm. I was fortunate to work with Ian during my time as dementia lead for Somerset - he has kindly offered to come to talk on his work. He is a very inspirational speaker and is keen to share his experience of developing dementia friendly communities (amongst many other things!). Ian's talk will last for around 45 minutes plus time for questions. Following the talk you are welcome to stay for a 50-minute Dementia Friends information session. Most of us know someone who has dementia, and this session will help you to understand what it's like to live with dementia and how small actions can help someone who is affected by it. We really hope you or a representative will be able to join us please could you respond to me to say whether or not you can attend by Monday 13 June to enable us with our planning and refreshments.
