The Western Front

We have all been reminded this particular year that scarcely a family was untouched by loss during the First World War. And something of the scale of loss was brought home to us when we joined the packed crowd at the Menin Gate on a summer evening in Ypres, with many school parties from Britain and some from Germany, for the ceremony at which buglers sound Last Post and, after the silence, Reveille, and families of the fallen lay wreaths. The gate bears the names of 54,890 whose bodies were never found or identified, and whose memorial inscription is 'Known unto God'.

We were there because, by a series of chance connections with some folk in Chiswick and others in Australia, we had now, for the first time, got to know that one of our two families lost two sons on the Somme, and the other had a son in the Australian army who fought there, won a medal for bravery, and survived to die in 1942, apparently poor and alone, and was buried in an unmarked grave in Queensland. Neither of us had known anything of these three men but now we were to visit the place where all three of them had fought and two of them had died.

We were expertly guided by the archivist of King's School, Bruton, an old friend, who is researching the graves and histories of the Old Boys of that school and of the men named on Bruton town War Memorial who died on the Western front. We went through the channel tunnel and drove straight to 'The Silent Picket', a house in the village of Martinpuisch, where an English couple offer hospitality combined with expert and detailed knowledge of the battle-fields. In the evening, I mentioned my great uncle, Lance Corporal Herbert Vallins of the 12th Australian infantry battalion, and what I knew of his brave action at Dernancourt. Overnight, our host researched the relevant action in Australian war diaries, and, almost unbelievably, next morning, took us on a short drive to the very scene, beside the railway embankment, where, with his Lewis Gun, Herbert was (to quote the citation for his award of the Military Medal) 'largely responsible for driving the enemy back off his sector.....and although very ill, refused to leave the line until wounded...' We just stood and marvelled.

Nearby we had looked down across miles of the now green and fertile valley of the Somme from the lookout where General Rawlinson, on the terrible first day of the battle, saw the horrors unfolding below. And at Delville wood, we saw 'the last tree', said to have been the only survivor when all the rest were blackened stumps.

The vast and imposing memorial designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens at Thiepval dominates the surrounding landscape from a high ridge, and bears 72,194 names of those 'to whom the fortunes of war denied the known and honoured graves given to their comrades in death', and it was high up on one of the beautifully inscribed stone panels there that we found the name of Private Frank Coombs, of the London Rifles, one of Sallie's two uncles who both died in July The people of St Michael's Church, Chiswick, have researched the names of all those listed on the war memorial there and they had contacted Sallie about these two uncles of hers of whose lives and deaths she had never heard before. Frank and his brother Leslie had been amongst the first from the parish to volunteer for service in 1914, Leslie in the 'Stockbrokers' battalion' of the Royal Fusiliers. And it was at the cemetery at Puchevillers, with rows of headstones shoulder to shoulder where great numbers had died at the casualty station there that we found his headstone. He had died of wounds on 12 July.

Later, we were shown the grave of the youngest soldier known to have been killed on the Western Front, Private Albert French, aged 16, and we walked to a cemetery in a lovely clearing made in the woods at Ploegsteert (familiarly called Plugstreet by the British), where many of the Somerset Light infantry, including Brutonians, are buried.

Then, not far away, we saw the Christmas Truce Cross. It marks the place where soldiers of both sides laid down their weapons, clambered out of their trenches, and went to meet in No Man's Land, greeting each other peaceably as fellow human beings.



From the Rector, Greetings.

In the Church's calendar November is sometimes referred to as Remembrance-tide. It begins with *All Saints* day when we celebrate that great company of people who over the centuries have shared God's love with their neighbours. This is immediately followed by *All Souls* day when we remember loved ones who have died. For the first time, last year we marked that with a special Service in Temple-combe Church. We will be holding a similar Service in Henstridge Church at 3pm on 2nd November. We invite all those who would like to come to a Service to remember with love and thanks loved ones who have died. As part of the Service those present are invited to light a candle as a way of remembering.

Then there is Remembrance Sunday and/or Armistice Day. Earlier in the year we commemorated the beginning of World War One. Armistice Day originally commemorated the end of that terrible war. Now it gives us an opportunity to remember all those who have given their lives in the service of their country in all the wars that have happened since the end of the 'war to end all wars'. It is a remembering that goes hand-in-hand with a commitment to work for peace in our time.

Right at the end of the month we come to the Season of Advent. Then we remember the promised time when swords are beaten to ploughshares, and spears to pruning hooks. It is in the light of that promise, that hope, that Christians are called to be instruments of God's peace now.
