Ham Hill has a long and fascinating history. Evidence of past human settlements can be traced back more than 4000 years. During this fun packed walk you will have the chance to find out about our Pre-historic, Iron Age, Roman, Medieval and more recent ancestors. And you will also be able to experience some breathtaking views of the surrounding countryside.

About the route

We have marked out a 5 kilometre route (about 3 miles) which will start and finish at the car park and picnic area by the Ranger Station. The route is generally fairly easy with just one or two steeper and uneven pathways.

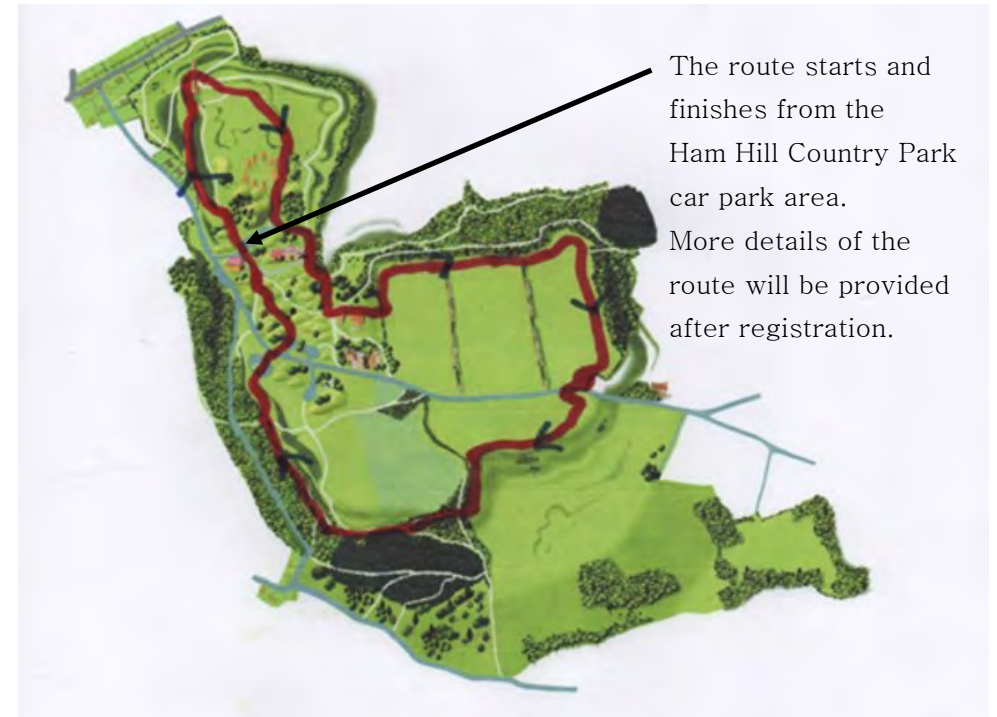
