Battle of the Somme 100th anniversary.

In common with towns and communities throughout the Country we observed the 100th anniversary of the Battle of the Somme on 1st July. We chose to have our ceremony at 11 a.m. which enabled Revd. Peter Dixon, Chaplain to 1 Regiment Army Air Corps, to be present to officiate for us as the military had their commemoration earlier that day. We were very fortunate too to have soldiers from 1 Regiment Army Air Corps to be an honour guard and stand vigil at the war memorial. The timings also enabled Sgt. Ian Scullion RM to be present and play Last Post for us.





I am so very grateful to the Revd Dixon for organising such a meaningful service and for all his assistance with the Order of Service and format etc. I am sure we all felt the emotion of the day and what happened 100 years ago. We particularly wished to honour our six soldiers who were killed at the Battle of Somme, two of whom - Walter Humphries and Walter Talbott were both killed on the first day of that infamous battle. Our other four soldiers George Cash, John Goodfellow, Lewis Vallis and Henry Wadman died later in the fighting which went on until the November of 1916

As a poignant gesture the Royal British Legion suggested that as part of the observance of the centenary a symbolic blast of a whistle denoting "over the top" should be sounded and Steve Lee gave the three blasts on a replica of the whistle used at the time. We were so pleased to be joined by students from King Arthur's School who gave four very moving readings of contemporary letters of soldiers who took part in the battle. We were greatly privileged to have had such distinguished honoured guests, Howard Ellard—Mayor of Wincanton and several councillors, Robert Mansaugh OBE—County President RBL, Robert McDonald—County Chairman RBL and Lt. Col. Gavin Rundle—Officer Commanding 1 Regiment Army Air Corps. I felt very privileged too in being asked to lay a wreath for Walter Talbott on behalf of Walter's family in Wales.

August trip 20th August Taunton/Bishops Lydeard/Minehead

I may have confused people on our trip to Sidmouth by saying that the August trip would be a different date but just to clarify, the date of the August trip is **20th August** as originally shown in the last Sandbag.

The format is as follows:-

Leave Wincanton Memorial Hall at 9 a.m. and make a one hour coffee stop in Taunton, then we will go to Bishops Lydeard steam train station to enable anyone who wants to go on the steam train to Minehead to board there. The cost of a standard single train ticket to Minehead is seniors £11.40, adult £12.70 and children £6.20 which is payable at the station. If enough people want to go on the steam train I am happy to book a group discounted ticket using my own credit card. I will advise members the new price once I know if we can get a group wishing to go on the train and members can pay me direct.

Those who do not wish to go on the steam train can stay on the coach and continue to Minehead. The coach will park in the coach park at the side of the steam train station so it will be easy for everyone to connect up for the journey home late afternoon. Cost of the coach remains at £12 adults and £6 children.

Wareham and Lulworth Cove—17th September

We will be going to Lulworth Cove on 17th September with a coffee stop at Wareham. We will leave Wincanton at 9 a.m. and arrive in Wareham around 10.45 a.m. leaving around noon and go then to Lulworth Cove for the afternoon.
